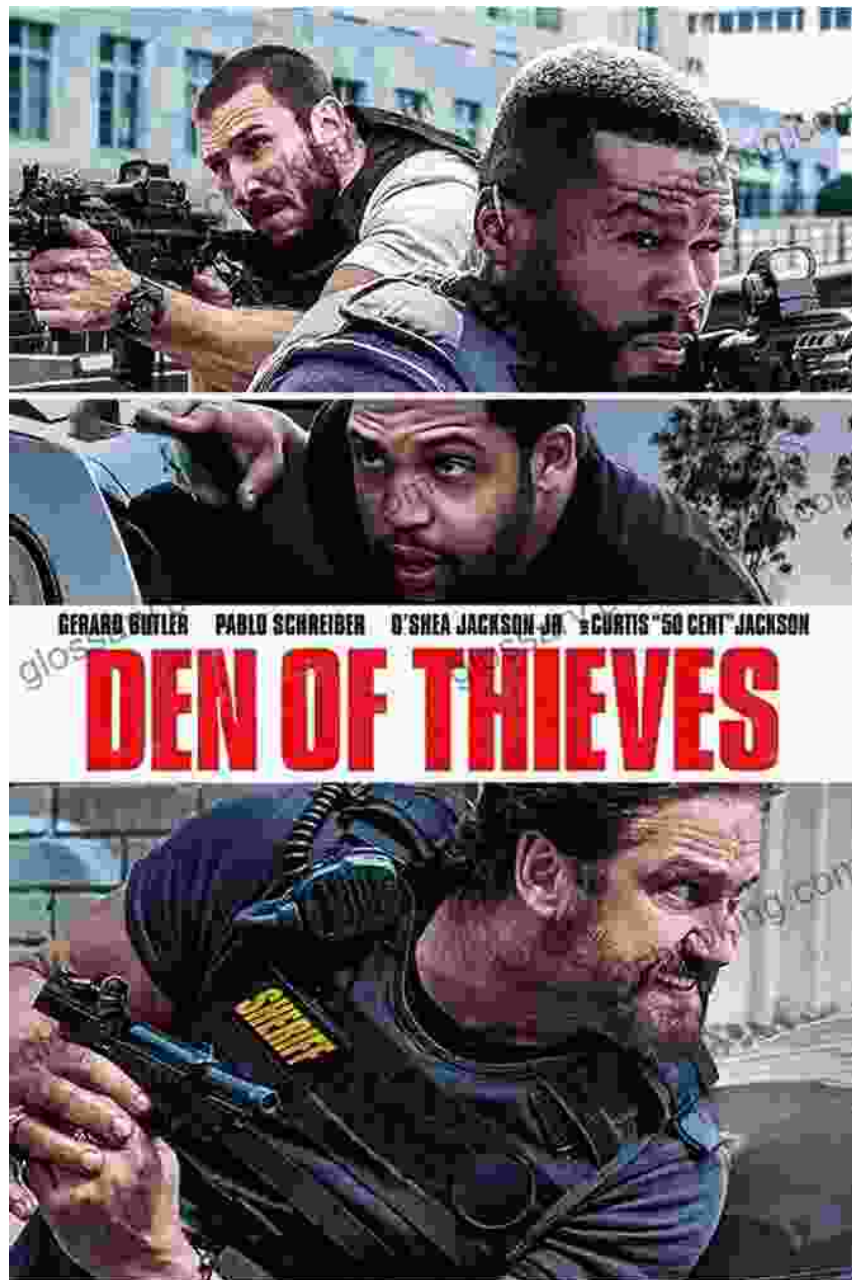

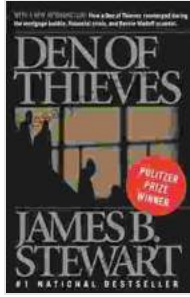

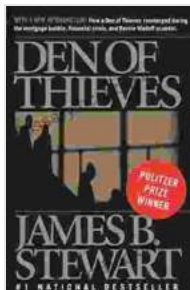
Style

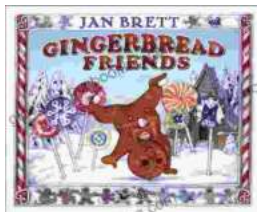
