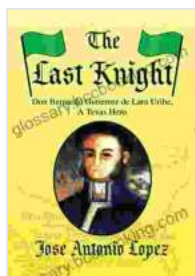


Don Bernardo Gutierrez De Lara Uribe: A Texas Hero

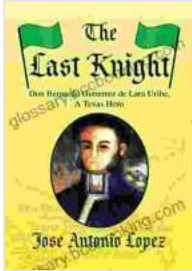

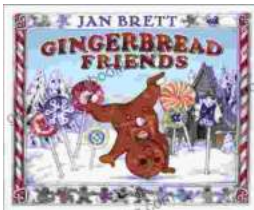
